Since 1983, the Métis National Council (MNC) has represented the Métis Nation at the national and international levels. The Métis people constitute a distinct Aboriginal nation largely based in western Canada with a population of 350,000 to 400,000. The Métis Nation grounds its assertion of Aboriginal nationhood on well-recognized international principles. It has a shared history, a common culture, a unique language, and extensive kinship connections from Ontario westward, a distinct way of life, a traditional territory and a collective consciousness.
