The week continued with more meetings, including: meeting with the Official Opposition Caucus; Deputy Minister of Health; Official Opposition Critic for Education, MCFD, and child care; senior technicians from the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation, and lastly, a meeting with the Minister of Mental Health and Addictions.
