REFERRED TO THE MÉTIS YOUTH BC COUNCIL AT THE JUNE 2024 MÉTIS NATION GOVERNING ASSEMBLY

Subject: Métis Nation Youth Definition

WHEREAS

1. Canada in working with the United Nations has defined their age for Youth as 15-34 years of age and making up one quarter of Canada's population.

- 2. Youth are expected to have higher and higher qualifications and have access to less and less resources.
- 3. The transition period in life is getting longer and more intensive.
- 4. There has been a historical want to spit youth into two groups so we can have more age specific programing.
- 5. The Youth Act does not currently have an age out policy.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT

- A. In Article 38 of the Constitution, "thirty (30)" and insert "thirty-four (34)" in its place.
- B. The following changes be made to the Youth Act
 - i. In Article 3.8, strike the word "**Métis**" preceding the word "**Youth**" and strike the number "30" and insert "34" in its place.
 - ii. Add the following as Article 3.8.1:

Métis Youth will have two categories:

- "Métis Youth" refers to Citizens between the ages of 15 to 20 inclusive; and
- "Young Adults" refers to Citizens between the ages of 21 to 34 inclusive.

- iii. Add the following as Article 5.12: "Upon turning 35 a person is no longer considered a Youth.
- C. In the *Electoral Act,* strike all instances of the number "30" or word "thirty" that refer to age, and insert the number "34" or words "thirty-four" in their place as appropriate.
