FAQ for MNBC Citizens Running for MWBC, MYBC, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ Regional Representatives

What are the positions available for the 2025 By-election?

There is one Métis Women BC (MWBC), one Métis Youth BC (MYBC), and one Métis 2SLGBTQQIA+ BC (M2SBC) Representative elected in each Region. For the 2025 by-election, the following regional positions are open:

In the event of a regional vacancy for the MWBC and MYBC positions between elections, the Regional Governance Council will recommend a representative to the MNGA. In the event a regional vacancy for a 2SLGBTQQIA+ regional representative, the 2SLGBTQQIA+ Provincial Governance Council will recommend a representative to the MNGA.

What are the key goals of the MWBC, MYBC, and M2SBC?

The key goals of the Governing Councils are to:

- Empower Métis Women, Youth, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ people to fulfill their potential in all aspects of their lives;
- Engage and listen to Métis Women, Youth, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ people on the matters important to them;
- Bring the valuable perspectives of Métis Women, Youth, and 2SLGBTQQIA+ to all levels of government.

What are the responsibilities of Regional Representatives?

Regional Representatives are members of their respective Governing Council, and have the following general responsibilities:

- Attend all MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC meetings as voting members
- Participate in strategic planning for the MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC Council, when applicable
- Attend Regional Governance Councils (RGCS) as voting members
- Attend all MNBC Metis Nation Governing Assemblies (MNGAs) as sponsored participants
- Attend all MNBC Annual General Meetings (AGMs) as sponsored participants
- Adequately prepare for meetings (reading agendas, minutes before the meeting)
- Attend Community and regional events and seek ways to engage with MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC persons locally.
- Represent the interests of the MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC persons in their respective region.
- Communicate the voice of MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC persons and advocate on their behalf by bringing observations, concerns, and findings to 2SLGBTQQIA+ Council meetings.
- Create awareness through MNBC programs and events available to MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC persons in BC and promote MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC persons participation in programs and events

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What is the time commitment?

MWBC/MYBC/M2SBC Representatives are elected for 4 year terms. During those 4 years, regional representatives can expect the following (minimum) time commitment:

What Supports are Available to help Regional Representatives meet their responsibilities?

Regional Representatives receive a monthly honorarium of \$150 to cover costs related to their role. Canada Revenue Agency rules require that a T4A slip is issued once honoraria exceeds \$500; MNBC will issue a T4A to Council members in time for tax submission. Regional Representatives also have up to \$2000 per year to cover travel expenses within their region, and are sponsored by MNBC to attend the in-person MNGA and AGM every year.

MNBC staff support is provided by Governance, the Ministry of Women and Gender Equity (MOWGE), and the Ministry of Youth (MOY) as appropriate.
