

## League Coordinator: Indigenous Rookie League (IRL)

In partnership with the charitable arm of the Toronto Blue Jays, Jays Care Foundation, the Lower Mainland is proud to be the hub for the 15<sup>th</sup> Indigenous Rookie League (IRL) across Canada. IRL is an integrated slo-pitch league for ages 12-18 that focuses on building culture, community and connection.

### **About the League Coordinator Role**

The League Coordinator's responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Support a 6-team slo-pitch league (Tsawwassen, Chilliwack, Vancouver, Fraser Valley, North Vancouver, Surrey/Delta)
- Work with approximately 3 coaches per team and act as a liaison between teams, coaches & MoSAL
- Step in to support practices and games as needed (pitching, subbing, scorekeeping, diamond set up, ump)
- Help manage equipment (bring to and from practices/games) and assist with picking up team snacks/food when required
- Address and help resolve conflicts in a timely and respectful manner
- Observe what's working well in the league, what could be improved and share feedback with MoSAL
- Make decisions in real time to support teams and keep IRL running smoothly
- **Able to attend a minimum of four in-person events per week (2 practices and 2 games, approximately 12 hours weekly).** Practices take place on weekday evenings; games are on Saturdays and/or Sundays. MoSAL will provide schedule

### **What You Bring**

A successful League Coordinator will demonstrate the following

- **Experience working with Indigenous communities and youth**
- **Reliable and dependable**  
You're able to travel to and from activities. Consistently show up to support teams-attending a minimum of four in person events per week

- **Independent and self-motivated**  
Take initiative and find creative ways to add value to the league. You're adaptable and able to use sound judgment and make decisions independently when needed
- **Team-oriented**  
Enjoy working with communities, coaches and players of different ages
- **Strong interpersonal skills**  
Approachable, kind and confident in handling conflict in a respectful way
- **Organized**  
Comfortable managing point sheets, keeping track of schedules and staying on top of league details

## **Requirements**

- 19+ years old
- Able to obtain and provide a Criminal Record Check (CRC)
- OFA Basic (or higher) or willingness to obtain
- Experience in baseball, softball, or slo-pitch
- Consistent and reliable transportation
- Available for the full 9-week season (June 8 to August 9), including full days on August 8 & 9 for the league wrap-up tournament
- Able to attend Jays Care League Coordinator Training in Toronto (April 27-30, all expenses covered, including attending a Blue Jays game)
