Family Support Worker (Full Time Position)

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree, preferably in Social Work or Child & Youth Care.
- Knowledge of Aboriginal cultures and contemporary issues affecting Aboriginal peoples, preferably Métis.
- Working knowledge of Child Welfare services and the *Child, Family & Community Services Act* of British Columbia.
- Excellent organizational, record-keeping and case management skills.
- Valid driver's license and reliable transportation required.
- Successful candidate will be subject to a criminal record review, police record check and other reference checks

Experience:

- One to three years recent experience working with children and families involved with Child Protection, through the Ministry of Children & Family Development or a Delegated Aboriginal Agency.

Location:

- At the office of Island Métis Family & Community Services Society, located at 345 Wale Road, Victoria, BC.

This position requires union membership. Hourly rate is \$27.22, based on Paraprofessional Grid 14 – Step 1 as governed by the current *Aboriginal Services Collective Agreement*. Normal schedule of work is 35 hours per week, performed Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, may include other hours based on agency need.

In accordance with *Section 41 of the Human Rights Act*, preference may be given to persons of Métis ancestry. *This position is open to male and female applicants.*
