

AGM 2021 Voting and Registration FAQ's

Q: Do I have to register to attend the MNBC AGM?

A: Yes, you must register for the AGM. Registration link can be found [here](#).

Q: Do I have to be a MNBC Citizen to register for the AGM?

A: Yes, you must be a current MNBC Citizen to register for the AGM.
A livestream of the AGM proceedings will be provided for the public to observe.

Q: Why does the registration form ask for my date of birth?

A: Date of birth information will be used by MNBC Registry to verify registrant information.

Q: When does registration for the AGM close?

A: You can register for the AGM up to and during the date of the AGM. It is advised that you register as soon as possible, as it may take up to 24 hours to process new registrants and issue voting credentials.

Q: Who is running the voting system for the MNBC AGM?

A: The voting system is provided and administrated by an independent company, Data On The Spot (DOTS). Further information can be found [here](#).

Q: How are voting credentials issued for the MNBC AGM?

A: All registrants for the AGM are first confirmed to be on the central registry list of MNBC Citizens. Once confirmed, MNBC provides the name and email address of the registered delegate to DOTS, who will then issue voting credentials, and instructions on how to vote, to the registered delegate.

Q: How will voting be conducted at the AGM?

A: Once a resolution has been debated at the AGM, the Chair will declare voting is open on the resolution. Voting will be open for three minutes for each question. The Chair will announce when one minute is left for voting, and when voting is closed.

Q: What measures are MNBC taking to ensure voting integrity in the AGM?

A: MNBC is taking multiple steps to ensure voting integrity of the AGM. These include:

- Citizens must register for the AGM, and be confirmed on the central registry list, to be issued voting credentials;
- A unique email address must be given for each voting credential issued – only one credential per email;
- Voting credentials are issued with a unique password, which must be entered to cast a vote;
- MNBC will announce the number of delegates registered for the AGM, therefore setting the maximum number of votes eligible to be cast during the AGM;
- Delegates must demonstrate they are present at the meeting to be able to cast votes at the AGM. Delegates will do so by casting a ballot at the start of the day, and after every break, to

confirm their presence. Once all present delegates have confirmed their attendance, the number of present delegates will be announced to the AGM, and no delegates will be admitted to the AGM until the next break in proceedings.

- Voting results for resolutions, with numbers for/against/abstaining displayed at the end of voting.
- The servers utilized by DOTS to run their election software have high levels of encryption and network security. Additionally, DOTS will be monitoring the election results in real time and will alert MNBC of any discrepancies.
